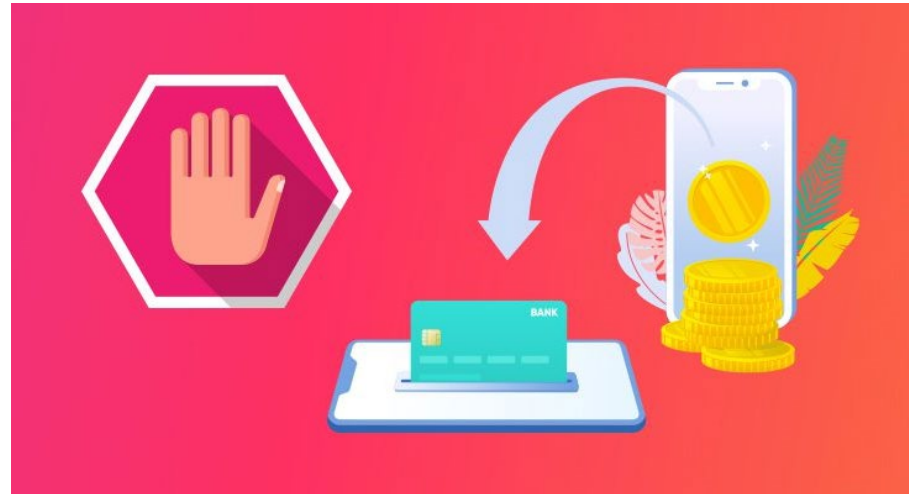

INTERNET CASINOS SUCK

The pretend video games have never cut it for me. Jackpot Party and the others have realistic action but it just doesn't translate to *real* action. There's no risk in it. No, for that kind of excitement, I'd have to turn to online casinos. I resisted for as long as I could – I knew it would piss me off. I researched to find the legal ones. And then, finally, in April, I broke down and cashed in. In the weeks that followed I would lose an ungodly amount of cash and resort to begging for my winnings. And I am still haven't been, paid. This one was 40x my cash in and bonus, which for \$430 meant I would need to gamble about 19K. So, I played and played and played and lost and lost and lost. In the end, I was left with only a few hundred eligible for withdrawal.

Screw it. I figured I would take what's left and be done with this site forever. Now begins the withdrawal approval process. This is another systemic online function which is designed to make you give up and gamble. It's been two weeks now. I've sent forms, documents IDs, and credit card images countless times. The support center in Solei or godknowswhere only looks at this stuff every two or three business days and I've given this place enough info to buy a house in my name.

This is online gambling as I've always known it. I am so stupid. They may get it right one day but until then, gambling online is heartbreaking.

FIVE STAR: DOUBLE SUPER TIMES PAY (TRIPLE DOUBLE)



Hot Take: This game is responsible for my biggest hits as well as my biggest losses. Always looking for a \$2 machine to play at every casino.

Overall: This game has incredible hits but you should not sit down unless you have plenty of ammo.

Special Feature: A chance to get a 2-10 X multiplier on Deal and Draw (must play extra 2 credits for this).

Pros: The Triple Double hits with the multiplier will make you need to change your underwear.

Cons: You better come with a lot of ammo to this machine. They can be very unfriendly.

Description: Standard 5 card Deal/Draw poker machine with higher payouts for Aces, 2s, 3s, 4s and combinations thereof with a chance to get a 2-10 X multiplier on Deal and Draw (must play extra 2 credits for this).

Bet: 7 credits per line (5 for max bet and one credit each for Deal/Draw multiplier chance).

Casinos to Play At: Most casinos carry this game although not many have all the denominations. Oceans and Hard Rock Atlantic City are my favorite places for this machine and game.
